

Initiatives and Announcements

RSC-BMCS Membership Subscription Renewal

The BMCS organises a range of high quality conferences and runs initiatives that support the education and training of the next generation of medicinal chemists. We also have an outreach programme which supports chemistry clubs and provides enhanced equipment to schools. PhD Student and Post-Doc Conference Bursaries

Did you know that most BMCS sponsored meetings have a number of bursaries available for PhD and post-doctoral students? Normally these awards are up to a value of £300 for one-day events and up to £600 for multi-day events, and help to cover costs, including registration and travel. Preference will be given to members of the RSC (and meeting co-sponsors if applicable), especially those who are selected to give posters.

The BMCS International Travel Prize

Each year, the BMCS offers a number of International Travel Prizes for use in the following year, up to a value of £2,000, to postgraduate students enrolled in research programmes (PhD or Masters) in UK institutions. The closing date for applications is 31st August.

Capps Green Zomaya Memorial Award

Nominations for this biennial award in medicinal or computational chemistry are invited on behalf of anyone who is judged to have made an important contribution to the discovery or development of new medicines. Nominees should be up to the age of 40. The value of the Award is £2,000 and the awardee will be invited to deliver a presentation at the Medicinal Chemistry in Eastern England symposium held in May the following year.

Malcolm Campbell Memorial Prize

Nominations for this biennial prize are invited for an individual or team who has made the most significant scientific contribution to biological chemistry. The prize-winner(s) may be from academia or industry, and their work should be timely and contemporaneous. The Prize has a value of £2,000, and is presented at the next RSC / SCI Cambridge MedChem symposium.

The RSC BMCS Lectureship

Each year, the BMCS supports a lecturer to deliver up to six lectures at six institutions within the UK, aimed particularly at first-year undergraduates. These include an initial lecture as part of the RSC series of Thursday evening public lectures at Burlington House. The closing date for applications is 31st January each year.

Dr David Witty formerly of Convergence holds the BMCS Lectureship in 2019/20.

The RSC BMCS Researcher Mobility Fellowships

The BMCS is pleased to announce a new call for the Researcher Mobility Fellowships, to drive excellence in the UK-based science. These fellowships of up to £5,000 aim to support short-term placements (up to 3 months) between industry and academia in areas of interest to the BMCS, namely bioorganic chemistry, medicinal chemistry, chemical biology and agriscience. Applications should be jointly submitted by academic and industrial partners by 30th October each year.

Hall of Fame and Medal

The BMCS is pleased to announce a new call for nominations for The Hall of Fame and associated medal, to recognise prominent chemists for outstanding, sustained, significant contributions to any area of interest to the BMCS, e.g. medicinal chemistry, agriscience, bioorganic chemistry, chemical biology. Independent nominations may be submitted from March to September each year.
