Thanks to the successful fund-raising activities of the BMCS the number of prizes awarded has grown steadily, from 6 in the first year to 15 in 2020. The total number of entries for the 2020 Prizes was higher than ever, the diversity of projects even greater, and the quality of all the applications extremely impressive, making the selection of the eventual winners a hugely challenging task for the judges. They, along with all the members of the BMCS committee, would like to congratulate the winners, and sincerely thank all the participants for the excellence of their applications.
