The BMCS introduced the International Travel Prize programme in 2014 as an initiative to support, encourage and develop the training of next-generation research leaders. The winners receive funding of up to £2000 to support their attendance at, and travel to, high impact international conferences relevant to their projects. The diversity of projects in the 2021 applications was even greater than in previous years, and the quality of all the applications extremely impressive, making the selection of the eventual winners a hugely challenging task for the judges.
