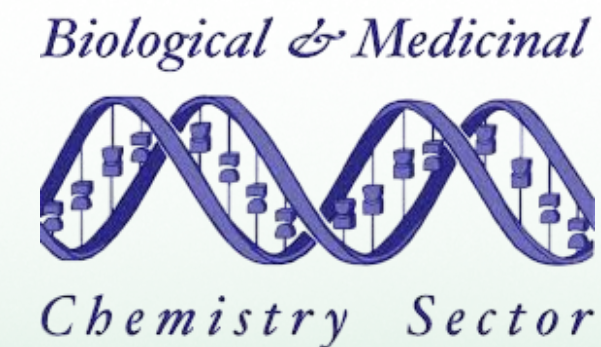


# The RSC-BMCS International Travel Prize Winner 2026
